I write in connection with your original request for information dated 30 September and your subsequent letter dated 11 November 2005 following receipt of my letter of 2 November 2005.

I have now made further enquiries about Common Purpose within our organisation and can disclose the following information to you. I regret that information was not made available to you originally and thank you for your further information that assisted my enquiries. This information is based upon disclosure made by the Finance Department and the four Basic Command Unit Finance and Administration Managers who have all provided information.

1. Total amount spent by Devon and Cornwall Constabulary over the last 5 years on Common Purpose, including amounts spent on hosting meetings, travel, time etc.

Total recorded payments to Common Purpose since 2001 that we have found comes to $\pounds 57,100.25$

I attach Record 1 that is a list of invoices paid in connection with Common Purpose.

I regret that I am unable to provide you with information about further costs such as time or travel costs. To identify travel and subsistence payments made in relation to Common Purpose would require all travel and subsistence claims to be individually reviewed and Common Purpose graduates would have to be identified and asked to provide evidence of hours spent attending training and the other various events. The total cost of gathering all this information for use is unknown. However it clearly will be above the 18 hours which is the "appropriate level" of cost of locating and retrieving the information as stated in the Freedom of Information (Fees and Appropriate Limit) Regulations 2004. Therefore, in accordance with the Freedom of Information on the additional costs paid in relation to Common Purpose. However I do understand that the main cost to the organisation is the courses themselves, after which 'graduates' attend other events, usually at no cost to the organisation.
