2. South Yorkshire Staff

3. 20:20

20:20 is Common Purpose's programme that brings together senior leaders from across the UK to examine the drivers that will change our society over the next 20 years. Participants explore how these drivers will affect them, their organisations and the wider community. The next programme will take place 29 October – 2 November 2007.

4. Your Turn

As you know initial discussions have taken place with LEA's across South Yorkshire about the possibility of bringing Your Turn, Common Purpose for Year 9 in schools, to South Yorkshire. Sheffield, Barnsley and Rotherham are particularly keen to progress this.

In Sheffield all secondary schools have been written to by the chair of the secondary headteachers association in order to gauge interest in the programme. To date 16 schools have responded positively. The pleasing thing is that the 16 represent the most diverse mix of schools. We are now working on securing funding, hopefully through Legi, in order to launch the first Sheffield programme before the end of the year.

Rotherham has agreed funding for the next 3 years. The programme will be open to all secondary schools. The first one will run during 2008.

In Barnsley we are working on a pilot programme, which will run before the end of the year. If this is successful it will be used to market future programmes.
